Essential Packing Tips

- Use high-quality packing materials: bubble wrap, packing paper, and sturdy boxes
- Wrap each fragile item individually with bubble wrap or packing paper
- Fill empty spaces in boxes with packing peanuts or crumpled paper
- Label boxes clearly as "FRAGILE" and "THIS SIDE UP" when applicable
- Use dish pack boxes for dishes and glassware with cardboard dividers
- Pack heavier items in smaller boxes to prevent box failure
- Never pack fragile items with heavy items in the same box
- Take photos of valuable items before packing for insurance purposes
- Consider professional packing services for extremely valuable items
- Keep an inventory list of all packed fragile items
